Pentecost

On this Sunday of Pentecost, our focus Scripture is:

Acts 2:1-21 NIV The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.



⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

13 Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Peter Addresses the Crowd

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

¹⁷ "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.

¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

For the Christian Church, Pentecost used to be an important celebration in the Christian year; for many it eclipsed even Easter, for it was seen as the completion of God's work. Even the Resurrection took on its true meaning in the context of God's Spirit arriving among the early disciples.

Over time, the significance of Pentecost has faded somewhat. Yet, it is still a powerful celebration.

In the midst of all the turmoil we face in our world today, we have to believe that God's Spirit is indeed alive and present in our midst and goes with us wherever we may go!

To describe Spirit is still one of the biggest challenges facing those who lead worship. Suffice to say, as Creator God is holy mystery, so too is Spirit – often uninvited and unseen, yet ever present in our lives.

In the central Pentecost story in Acts 2, we find a curious piece thar sometimes gets overlooked: Luke, the author, speaks of how the spirit was *like* flames of fire, and *like* the howling a wind.

Perhaps it would be helpful to accept that we cannot fully comprehend the mysterious workings of God's Spirit and thus, any attempt to define it will always fall short.

The diverse gifts of God's Spirit weaves communities and creation into a wonderful quilt, beautiful and enriched by God's presence.

My prayer for this week is:

Creator God, Holy Spirit, come to us, come among us, come as the wind and cleanse us. Come as fire and burn, come as dew and refresh. Come, breathe upon us with gifts of new life, new inspiration, and fresh energy to witness to your saving love. Breathe upon us, Holy Spirit of God, and fit us for serving in your realm so that we may change the world.

From Verdun to Hollywood: Ruta Lee





Before she starred in such films as Seven Brides for Seven Brothers, Witness for the Prosecution and Funny Face, Ruta Lee was a child of Lithuanian immigrants growing up in wartime era Verdun. The picture at left shows her in front of the movie theatre on Wellington street in 1954, presumably at a premiere for Seven Brides... when she was just 19 years old. Her father, a tailor, had moved the family to Los Angeles just a few

years before. While still in high school Ruta got a job at Grauman's Chinese Theatre as a candy girl and then a box office cashier, but when her till was short one night, she was summarily fired. Years later, she would receive her very own star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, directly in front of that famous theatre. Ms. Lee, born Ruta Mary Kilmonis, turns 88 on May 30th.
